Research Day is coming on April 3, 2013 and some of you may be looking to publish your research in a peer reviewed journal. But which journal should you publish in? Have you considered submitting your article to an open access publisher?

Reputable open access journals have peer review standards just like traditional journals, but differ in the way that they are financially supported. Open access journals charge an article processing fee to the author, which can be similar to the fees charged for color, extra pages, etc. by traditional publishers. With the author paying up front, the author retains copyright ownership and everyone is free to read the article as soon as it is published.

Compare: Open Access/Traditional Journals

How do open access journals stack up against traditional journals? PLOS Medicine is the 5th ranked title (out of 155) in General and Internal Medicine, with an impact factor of 16.269. Retrovirology is 4th out of 32 Virology journals with an impact factor of 6.470.

PLOS Genetics and Genome Biology have two of the highest "Immediacy Indexes" (a measure of how quickly articles are cited after publication) for journals in Genetics and Heredity.  PLOS Public Library of Science	10% discount on Article Processing Fee	Seven peer-reviewed journals, including PLOS One, which publishes research in all areas of science and medicine.

In addition to these open access publishing institutional memberships, GW students, faculty and staff can take advantage of free publishing of case reports through the Library's institutional membership with BMJ Case Reports.

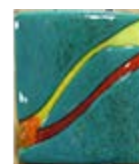
