Whether you are at the beginning, middle or last stage of research you can turn to your liaison librarian for help. Before beginning your research, consider consulting with your liaison librarian to explore what has been published on your research topic. We can help you determine the gaps within the existing literature. We're also available to meet with your research team to identify key databases and search terms as well as instruct them on how to effectively use RefWorks citation management tool to help organize and cite your sources. Research Support	How can a librarian help you:
Literature Review	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Conduct a preliminary literature search to establish what has been published on a topic Explore databases and key search terms Highlight gaps within the literature on your topic
Citation Support	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Help importing citations into RefWorks Instruction on how to use RefWorks Write-N-Cite tool to create in-text citations and bibliography Assist with complying with the citation format of the journal
Where to Publish	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Identify which journals to publish your study Rank journals impact factor within your discipline Help with NIH Public Access Policy and compliance
