Increasing the Human Capital Impact and Financial ROI of Employee Assistance Programs

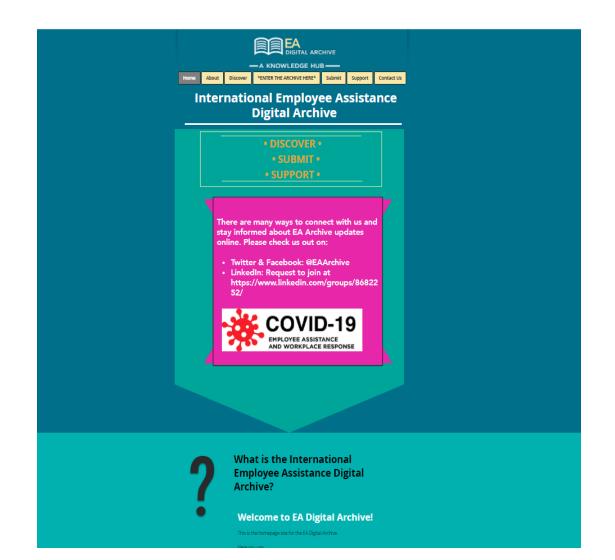

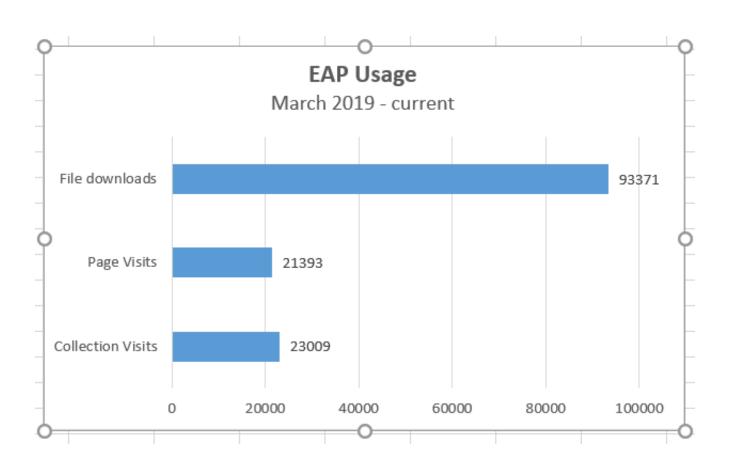
