NEW COPYRIGHT BILL PASSES
94th CONGRESS

The first comprehensive revision of the 1909 Copyright Law was approved by Congress on September 30. The bill is expected to be signed by President Ford and would take effect January 1, 1978. Major changes affecting library users include:

- clarification of "fair use" to permit a single copy of portions of a copyrighted work for scholarly or educational purposes.
- multiple copies for classroom use may qualify if certain tests of brevity and spontaneity are met.

Faculty and staff using photocopy machines should be aware of liabilities for copyright infringement. The Library will prominently display "a warning of copyright in accordance with requirements that the Register of Copyrights shall prescribe by regulation."

Photocopying for Interlibrary Loan is fair use if such activity is not in "such aggregate quantities as to substitute for a subscription to or purchase of such work." Specific guidelines for "aggregate quantities" are part of the legislative reports. The impact of these and other operating procedures cannot yet be clearly gauged.

Details on the new copyright law and its implementation will be reported in future issues.
