## LIBRARY TOURS AND ORIENTATIONS

The Reader Services Division of the Himmelfarb Library offers tours and orientations arranged on an individual or group basis. Contact the Chief of Reader Services, Cheryl A. Sloan, at ext. 2963 to make arrangements.

New students in the Nurse Practitioner Program were scheduled for an orientation on Friday, August 25, 2:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. in the Library.

On Monday, August 28, Freshman medical students toured the Library in groups of twenty from 9:30 a.m. to 11:50 a.m. There were seven groups and each group spent twenty minutes on the tour.

First year students in the Physicians' Assistant Program had an orientation Friday, August 25, from 1:30 p.m. to 3:00 p.m.

## LIBRARY ACCESS POLICY

The Library's facilities and resources are available to the whole University community and the wider community of persons requiring access to medical information between the hours of 8:30 am and 6:30 pm, Monday through Friday. However, to promote appropriate use of the facilities and resources during evening and weekend hours, the Library will limit access to its primary constituency - University faculty, Medical Center faculty, staff

and students, basic science graduate students, and all others enrolled in health related studies. This policy is in effect from Sept. 5, 1978 through May 25, 1979 excluding the semester break.

Faculty are to contact Shelley Bader, Chief, Access & Facilities Services Division concerning special access for students in their classes requiring use of the Himmelfarb Library's resources.

After 6:30 pm evenings and on weekends, users are to display to the circulation staff a blue, white, green or red Himmelfarb Library borrower's card or special access card.

### RESERVE REQUESTS

The Reader Services Division is accepting requests for items to be placed in the Reserve Collection for the Fall 1978 semester.

Faculty members who requested items last semester have been sent an information packet containing the following: 1) Core List of standard texts permanently in the Reserve Collection; 2) Reserve Request Form for additional materials required this fall; 3) Copyright Compliance Statement; 4) Personal Course List indicating materials requested last semester. A copy of the Core List has also been forwarded to Department Chairmen.

To expedite processing, please note that requests must be submitted at least two weeks prior to the date copies are required to be on Reserve. Bound journals or entire journal issues may be placed on Reserve only if they are personal copies of the faculty member. If photocopies of articles are required, they must be provided by the faculty member and be accompanied by a Copyright Compliance Statement indicating that the materials have been photocopied in accordance with the provision of Section 107 of the copyright law, PL 94-553. One Library copy of each published monographic item will be provided per fifty students with the maximum number being three copies.

### COPYRIGHT INFORMATION FILE

A copyright information file is located at the Reference Desk to serve the needs of Himmelfarb Library users.

Copies of the U.S. Copyright Law of 1976 (PL94-553) with an explanation of its provisions are

available together with a brief bibliography concerning the impact of the law on libraries, and several reprints which particularly focus on photocopy guidelines for researchers and educators. Users are invited to browse through these materials.

### NEW FILM ON TELEPHONE MANNERS IN AVSC

The Library and the Training Department of University Personnel Services have jointly purchased the film Telephone Manners. This 11 minute color telephone orientation program is designed to promote effective communication skills. Practical demonstrations emphasize placing and answering phone calls and taking accurate messages. The film will be utilized by the Library and the Training Office. However, any Department in the Medical Center may find the program useful in an internal training situation. The film is available for loan from the AV Study Center, x2856.

### ANALYSIS OF READERS' SURVEY

Information Interface readers were asked to complete a questionnaire in April to assist the library in assessing the use and efficacy of the newsletter. 8.8% of the total readership responded with full-time faculty showing the highest response rate (15.9%) within the Medical Center. The return rate for non-GWU Medical Center readers was 27.5%.

According to the respondents, the most frequently read feature is the Faculty Publications List (89.3% replied "always" or "sometimes"), followed by library related articles (86.7% said "always" or "sometimes") with the Acquisitions List the least read (65.3% answered "always" or "sometimes"). Nevertheless, 83.7% of the respondents use or borrow 1-6 items mentioned in the Acquisitions List. The library related articles are considered "always" or "sometimes" informative by 74.9% and 58.1% find the Faculty publications list "useful" or "very useful".

The "never" responses in descending order of frequency were:

20.5% - If you read it, do you find the (Faculty Publications) List useful?

11.7% - Do you read the library related articles?

10.2% - If you read the (library related) articles,

do you find them informative?

10.3% - Do you read the Faculty Publications List?

6.8% - Do you read the Acquisitions List?

3.4% - If you read it, about how many times did you use or borrow materials mentioned in the Acquisitions List?

Our thanks to all who completed and returned the survey. The responses to the survey will be used to try to focus the contents and distribution of future issues. Non-respondents will be surveyed again to determine their interest in remaining on the mailing list.

STAFF ACTIVITIES

Shelley Bader, Head, AV Study Center attended the 20th Annual Health Sciences Communications Association (HeSCA) meeting May 14-17 in Tucson, Arizona. As part of a study tour she visited the rural health mobile clinic system on the Papago Indian Reservation. Two-way color television, with audio and computer data links, connects physicians at the Indian Health Science hospital to the paramedic staff on the reservation. At the HeSCA Biomedical Libraries functional section business meeting, Shelley Bader was elected chairperson of that section for 1978-1979.

MLA Annual Meeting

The Medical Library Association (MLA) drew over 40% of its 4300 members to the 78th Annual Meeting in Chicago, June 10-15, 1978. Technical sessions, special interest groups, continuing education courses, and business and committee meetings provided opportunities to keep abreast of new developments, exchange information, update technical skills, and contribute to the ongoing work of the Association to the six members of the Himmelfarb Library staff who attended.

Continuing education courses, held on Saturday and Sunday prior to the opening plenary session, were attended by Merle Harrison, John Patruno, Janet Taylor, and Cheryl Sloan who enrolled in a total of five courses: Audio-visual Cataloging, CATLINE/AVLINE Searching, Library Management/Planning, General Biomedical Reference Tools and Introductory Data Collection and Analysis.

Cheryl Sloan participated in meetings of the Scholarship Committee, assisted at the Scholar-

ship Booth and attended the Scholarship Breakfast sponsored by the Institute for Scientific Information (ISI). For each MLA Member who attends the Breakfast, ISI contributes one dollar to the scholarship fund. Helen Kolbe participated in meetings of the Legislation Committee and the Ad Hoc Committee on Inter-Association Representatives. Nina W. Matheson, Director of the Library and an MLA Director, is Chairman of the 1980 National Program Committee. MLA will hold its annual meeting in Washington, D.C. in 1980.

Effective August 1, Helen Kolbe, former Himmelfarb Library Associate Director, joined Johns Hopkins University School of Public Health as Director of the Population Information Program. Warm best wishes from the staff went with her.
