## ANNOUNCING PDQ!

PDQ (Physician Data Query) is now available on the Himmelfarb Automated Library (HAL) system. PDQ is a cancer information database produced by the National Cancer Institute and is mounted on the library's computer. It is available to anyone who has dial or ISN access to the computer as well as on a designated terminal in the miniMEDLINE area.

PDQ may be used to locate information on state-of-the-art cancer treatment protocols, names and address of cancer specialists throughout the U.S., including major health care organizations and institutions serving cancer patients, information on active clinical trials, and disease and treatment patient information summaries.

## A DRIVE THAT TAKES YOU TO PLACES AND MORE DATA SPACES

In the Microcomputer Lab, we are regularly making new software available, as well as adding new "goodies" to our computer hardware. As you see changes occurring in the world of microcomputer technology, you will also see many of these changes reflected in the Microcomputer Lab.

One of these changes that has frequently been requested by our users is the addition of a 3 1/2" disk drive. I am happy to announce: "It's done!" Computer "B3" (an IBM) now has a Toshiba 3 1/2" disk drive, and it is ready to use!

Why buy a new drive? There are a number of advantages to using 3 1/2" disks: (1) They are smaller and easier to store and carry. (2) They are not bendable, as are the 5 1/4" disks, and are therefore easier to maintain. (3) Best of all, they store virtually twice as much data as the 5 1/4" floppy disks.

**Important!** When using the computer with this new 3 1/2" drive, keep the following in mind:

--This drive cannot be used without a specially configured 3.3 version of DOS, which is available at the AV Circulation Desk. (NOTE: Version 3.3 of DOS requires two diskettes.) DOS versions lower than 3.3 will not work with this drive, and only the specially configured 3.3 diskettes should be used.

--The new Toshiba 3 1/2" drive must be addressed as the "C" drive, not as "B", which is customary with two 5 1/4" drives. It is important to remember this whenever you undertake any DOS operations, such as Format, Diskcopy, Copy, etc. For example, if you want to format the disk in the 3 1/2" drive, the command would be "Format C:". If you enter "Format B:", the disk in the "A" drive (the DOS disk) would be formatted.

If you are using WordPerfect on this computer, you would put the program disk in the "A" drive, and your data disk in the 3 1/2" drive. Change the "A>" prompt to a "C>" prompt by typing "C:", and enter "A:wp".

If you have questions about using this new drive, please ask for assistance or look for instructions posted at the computer.
