The Himmelfarb Automated Library, **HAL**, will be expanding to better serve your information needs. The **miniMEDLINE** database has been expanded to contain references to 456 journals owned by the Library. August heralds the inauguration of the online catalog. Watch for new CD-ROM workstations offering improved access to the biomedical literature. The Library's Levine Lounge is being totally refurbished. The first floor itself will undergo modest renovation to better incorporate the terminals which will replace the card catalog as well as offer the full menu of available databases and services.

CINAHL on Compact Disc!

Nurses working on research projects and in-service presentations now have access to a database designed specifically to meet nursing information needs. The **Cumulative Index to Nursing and Allied Health Literature (CINAHL)** database is available back to 1983 in compact disc (CD) format on the first floor of the Library. There is no charge to use the database which is updated bimonthly, and the CD stations used to search CINAHL are available whenever the Library is open. You may search for references by author, words in article titles, nursing subjects. Concepts may be combined to create a customized bibliography on your topic. Himmelfarb Library Catalog Now Available Online

By September 1, the Himmelfarb Automated Library will expand its services to include the library's online catalog. Updated monthly, the online catalog will make searching for monographs, serials, and audiovisuals owned by the library easier and faster. Options for searching include author, title, MeSH (subjects), and keyword (which will include Boolean searching). The catalog will be available on terminals in the library, as well as by dial/ISN access. Himmelfarb Photocopy Service

Himmelfarb Photocopy Service (HPS) is available to Medical Center faculty, staff and students. HPS staff will retrieve items in the Library's collections and photocopy the requested material (providing there are not copyright restrictions). Each group of five articles will be completed and ready for pick-up one full working day after the order is submitted.

Cost is \$2 per article for articles 1-10 pages in length. Longer articles cost an additional \$0.10 per page. For an additional \$1.00 per article fee, HPS will fill out Interlibrary Loan forms for your cited articles which are not owned by Himmelfarb. For articles which are at the Gelman Library, HPS will retrieve copies for an added \$3.00 per article. Gelman articles may take longer than 24 hours to retrieve.

Himmelfarb Automated Library

The Himmelfarb Automated Library (HAL) provides access to library information resources from within the library as well as from the Hospital Reading Room, homes and offices. HAL contains several resources and continues to grow to meet the information needs of the Medical Center. Currently available are an electronic mailbox system called MAILMAN, miniMEDLINE, PDQ, Mentor, and the library's catalog. miniMEDLINE (a subset of MEDLINE) contains references covering the years 1986 to the present from over 450 journals owned by the library. PDQ is a cancer information database produced by the National Cancer Institute, and Mentor is a tool used by first and second year students to select local area physicians who will act as mentors. Coming soon are the library's catalog (see related article in this issue) and MICROMEDEX, a drug/poisoning/emergency information database.

In addition to being available in the library, HAL may be used 24 hours a day by dialing into the library's computer from any personal computer or terminal with a modem and a phone line. It may also be used via the ISN, the University-wide local area network. In order to use HAL by dial access or through the ISN you must complete a registration form to obtain an access code. Library Classes

The Himmelfarb Library staff will offer a variety of classes this Fall from microcomputer courses to research skills sessions. For a complete schedule of these classes, please consult the Himmelfarb Library Continuing Education Course Schedule which is included in this newsletter. Additional copies are available at the Reference Desk. Classes are open to Medical Center faculty, students and staff. A \$15.00 fee is charged to faculty and staff members who wish to attend microcomputer courses; students may take these classes for free. All other courses are available free of charge.

Hospital Satellite Network

The Library's Audiovisual Study Center maintains a collection of programs recorded from the Hospital Satellite Network (HSN). These programs, ranging from 30-minute updates to 4-hour teleconferences, cover traditional and timely subjects of interest to all health care professionals. Many offer continuing education credit.

The videotapes are 1/2 inch, VHS format, and may be checked out for one week for home or classroom use. Players are available in the AV study Center during library hours, or in the Hospital Reading Room 24 hours a day.

Online Services

The Library offers patrons access to over 200 online databases. In addition to MEDLINE, which covers the field of clinical medicine, there is a wide range of files available on business, cancer, health administration, and allied health topics. The result of an online search is generally a bibliography of journal references tailored to a requestor's specific needs. Current Awareness, or SDI, service may be arranged on topics of ongoing interest. Online searches may be requested by calling ext. 42850 or by completing one of the search request forms available at the Library's Reference Desk or in the Hospital Reading Room.

Search charges for MEDLINE, HEALTH, CANCER, BIOETHICS, and similarly priced databases are generally \$6.00 for Medical Center students and \$8.00 for Medical Center faculty and staff. For other databases, patrons are charged direct search costs.

The Library's Information and Instructional Services staff also provide support and consultation services to Medical Center Staff who do their own searching. Simply call ext. 42850 to inquire about BRS/Colleague, MEDLINE, PaperChase, and other online programs.

AV Study Center and Microlab

The Bloedorn Audiovisual Study Center (BAVSC) is on the third floor of Himmelfarb Library and is for the use of Medical Center students, faculty and staff. A valid Himmelfarb Library card is required for all loan transactions.

The BAVSC contains more than 1000 titles in the basic sciences and clinical medicine. Hospital Satellite Network (HSN) videotapes are recorded daily in 1/2 inch VHS format, and the collection contains over 1000 titles. These tapes circulate for one week.

The Microcomputer Labs are located in the AV Study Center and are for use by GW Hospital house staff, faculty, staff and students of the Medical Center. The Labs contain IBM-PC, Macintosh, and Apple IIe microcomputers. A laser printer and desktop publishing software are also available. There is an extensive collection of Computer - Assisted - Instruction (CAI) and applications software. Microcomputer hardware and software do not circulate. Orientations to the Microlabs are given every Wednesday 12:30 - 1:00, August 23 to October 18. No pre-registration is necessary.

Interlibrary Loan

Himmelfarb Library offers Interlibrary Loan (ILL) services to Medical Center faculty, staff and students. This gives access to materials not owned by the libraries at The George Washington University. E-mail is used to send requests to the nearest holding library. Most requests are filled in 10 to 14 days. The Library has installed a fax machine so that urgent interlibrary loan requests can be handled in a more timely manner. An article can be received the same day or overnight if it is available at another library with a fax. For further information, call ILL at ext. 42860.

Annual Booksale

The Himmelfarb Library's Annual Booksale will be held Tuesday and Wednesday, August 22 and 23 in the Levine Lounge at the entrance to the Library. The sale will include duplicates of new titles, as well as items weeded from the collection. Items will be priced from 50 cents. On Wednesday all remaining items be half the marked price.

Circulation

Himmelfarb Circulation staff want to remind all library patrons of current loan policies:

Books circulate 2 weeks and can be renewed up to 3 times unless requested by another library user.

Limited Loan Items circulate 3 days and are not renewable.

The current 5 years of journals circulate 2 hours and are not renewable. Journals older than 5 years circulate 7 days and are not renewable.

Reserve items circulate 2 hours and/or overnight and may be renewed.

Renewals may be made in person or by telephone at ext. 42962. No more than 6 items may be renewed by phone. Overdue items or items requested by another user may not be renewed.

All faculty, staff and student are subject to fines as follows:

For books, \$0.25 per item with a maximum of \$5 per item. For Limited Loan Items, \$1 per day per item with a maximum of \$5 per item. For current journals and reserves, \$1 per hour per item, with a maximum of \$5 per item.
