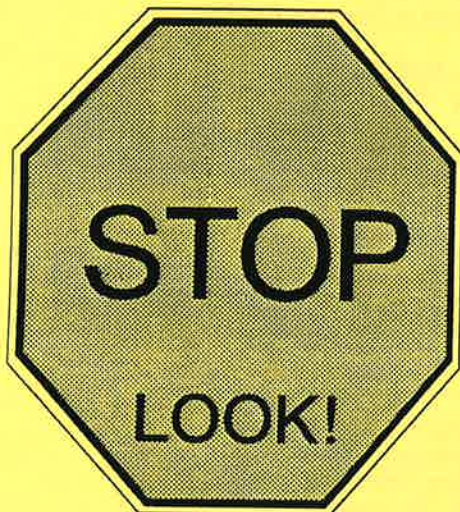

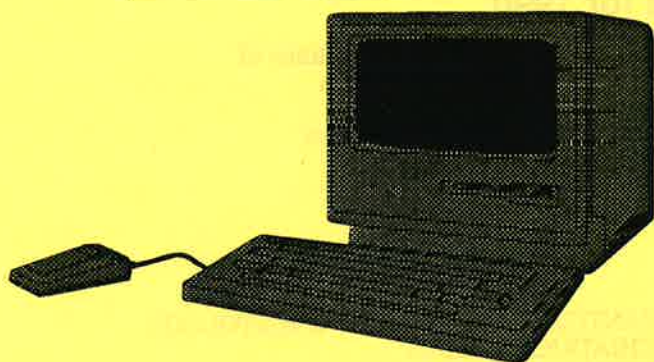
Spring Reserves

Desktop Publishing Comes to the Microlab!

Himmelfarb's Microcomputer Lab now houses a desktop publishing station, available for use by Medical Center faculty, staff and students. *WordPerfect 5.0*, *Aldus PageMaker* and *Harvard Graphics* are available at this station, which also contains a laser printer for quality output. Because of the cost of maintaining the laser printer, a fee of \$.20 per print will be charged for using this printer. Ask for the key to the desktop publishing station at the AV circulation desk.

Maternal Nutrition Training

Materials

The Himmelfarb Library's Audiovisual Study Center now offers a maternal nutrition training package produced by the March of Dimes Birth Defects Foundation. Entitled *Maternal Nutrition: Contemporary Approaches to Interdisciplinary Care*, the package consists of ten mixed-media teaching modules and is designed to provide health care professionals with a sound background in maternal nutrition.

Prospective audiences include physicians, nurses, nurse practitioners, nurse midwives, dieticians, nutritionists, social workers and health educators. Designed for a seminar setting, this teaching package will "help prepare health care professionals to ensure that their clients have adequate nutritional care during pregnancy."

The package contains ten self-contained modules, each offering a great deal of flexibility in presentation and format. Modules include slides, transparencies, videotapes, audiotapes, and printed handouts.

Also included are course outlines and printed bibliographies.
