Stay updated with Himmelfarb!

Himmelfarb Library provides access to tools and resources to keep you updated with current publications in your field, medical news and research, and literature in a broad range of specialties.

Browzine is a mobile app that helps you stay up to date with your favorite e-journals from your mobile device. Create a free account and designate Himmelfarb as your home library to start building your personalized bookshelf. You can save your favorite full-text journals to your shelf, and as new issues come out you will be able to browse them to read or save articles for later. Additionally, Browzine is compatible with RefWorks, so saving citations is simple.

NEJM Journal Watch is a useful tool for keeping you up to date on the latest in medical news and research. It surveys medical literature to select the most important research and guidelines, distills them into focused summaries, and frames them in a clinical context. You can browse by specialty or health topic. Sign up for a free account to set up email alerts for your specialty.

Scopus is a multidisciplinary database that allows you to stay up to date by setting author, document, or search strategy alerts. When you set up an alert, you will receive an email when specific authors have published a new article or when they are cited, when a certain document is cited in Scopus, or when new articles have been published for a saved search strategy. Sign up for a free Scopus account to save search strategies and set up alerts.

TIP: To help you access full-text articles through Himmelfarb Library, consider using LibKey Nomad, a Chrome browser extension that provides a "Download PDF" link if a PDF is available, and will otherwise provide full-text links and Documents2Go document delivery options via Himmelfarb Library.
