After extensive work on design and functionality specifications as well as demonstrations of various systems, the Library issued an RFP, evaluated the responses, and selected the Unicorn Library System from the Sirsi Corporation of Huntsville, Alabama. JOURNALS HOUSED AT WRLC

When the Himmelfarb Library opened in 1973, it must have seemed that there would be enough room in the stacks to accommodate many, many years of journals. Twenty-two years later, we are dealing with the information explosion of the last decade and its effects. The second-floor journal stacks have been full to capacity for the last two years, with no room for the next year, or new journals, or those that grow or divide into new parts.

Library staff examined usage statistics for the entire journal collection, title-by-title, volume-by-volume, year-by-year, and identified 554 titles which could be partially or completely removed from the shelves. The Library made arrangements with the Washington Research Library Consortium (WRLC) to house these volumes at its start-of-the-art facility located in Prince Georges County. As volumes were removed from the shelves, they were stored in boxes which were stacked in the second-floor alcove and in storage space in the Biomedical Communications Department, and eventually transferred to their new home. Over the next few months, Library staff will shift the remaining volumes on the second floor to make room for another 10 years of growth.

The titles which are affected are identified in HAL and also in Aladin, the catalog of the WRLC. If you need an article from one of these journals, please ask at the Circulation or Reference Desks. In most cases, a copy of the article can be faxed in a matter of hours, or delivered by courier the next day.



Freeing Library Space

Himmelfarb Library staff are well aware of the space crunch in the Library, especially during exam periods. In order to increase our space, the Library will be open ONLY to members of the George Washington University community during these times:
