MORE HAL NEWS

Two new features now appear in the Himmelfarb Automated Library (HAL). You can find them in the Online Catalog at any Library computer or by dialing in from your home or office.

- **New Book List:** A listing of the Library's acquisitions for the previous week can be found in the Online Catalog. From the initial menu, choose Announcements, then Recent Library Acquisitions. The list is updated weekly, on Monday. Any new book may have a hold placed on it. To place a hold, call the Circulation Desk at 202-994-2962.

- **Clinical Alerts:** These important announcements from the National Institutes of Health (NIH) are issued periodically to alert the health care community of new findings that have an immediate impact on clinical care. They are posted in the Online Catalog as soon as they are received. Choose Clinical Alerts from the initial menu. For more information, call the Reference Desk at 202-994-2850.

ANIMAL WELFARE INFORMATION

The 1985 amendment to the Animal Welfare Act requires researchers to review the scientific literature and demonstrate that alternatives to animal research procedures were either unavailable, or were considered and determined to be inappropriate. This applies to researchers who conduct procedures on vertebrate animals (except mice and rats) that cause more than momentary pain or have the potential to do so. The principal investigator must provide a written review of the methods and sources used to make these decisions.

To help meet this requirement, the Himmelfarb Library has all of the resources needed to perform an exhaustive literature search. To begin your search, you may access MEDLINE (1990-present), CANCERLIT (1988-present) and Science Citation Index (1988-present) at the CD stations in the Library. Reference staff are available from 8:30-6:00 PM Monday through Thursday, and 8:30-5:00 PM day on Friday to provide assistance with your search. There is no charge for this service.

In addition, reference librarians can search older years of the databases mentioned above, as well as TOXLINE, EMBASE, BIOSIS, Agricola, Zoological Record, Psychological Abstracts, and many others. The search charge for a MEDLINE, TOXLINE, or CANCERLIT search is \$8.00. Other databases cost more. Reference staff can also help you get connected to Internet discussion groups and World Wide Web sites on animal welfare, veterinary medicine and other topics. Publications from the Animal Welfare Information Center are kept in the Reference vertical file under "Animal-Research." Please call (202) 994-2850 for additional information and assistance.

New Journal Subscriptions for 1996

The Library will be adding 33 new titles to its collection in 1996.

Twenty of the new titles are being added to support the Exercise Science Program and have been funded through the program. Some of the Exercise Science Program titles are being transferred from the Gelman Library; the others are new titles. The other 13 titles were selected from a total of 56 faculty requests and titles with heavy interlibrary loan activity. All the titles were evaluated by Library staff and those needed for clinical care or to support the Medical Center's centers of excellence were selected. The total cost for the 13 new titles is \$1800, funded in part through rebates from publishers and the Library's consolidation of purchasing power with a change in book vendors.

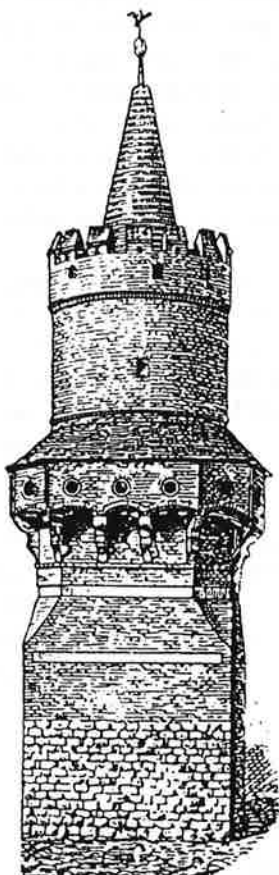
