


Health Information @ Himmelfarb Search Box on the Himmelfarb Library home page

The <u>Himmelfarb Search Box</u>, also known as Health Information @ Himmelfarb, is a comprehensive discovery tool for the library's resources. It includes most of the library's subscription content (journals, articles, online books, and streaming videos) as well as the library's physical collections (print books and journals, equipment, and physical media like DVDs).

You can change what you're searching to only article content or only online content using the down arrow on the right side of the search box. You can also select to search the contents of all the libraries in the <u>Washington Research Library Consortium (WRLC)</u>. Select Articles + GW & Consortium Catalog as shown below to include books and media at the other WRLC libraries, like Georgetown, American, and Howard. 
Health Information @ Himmelfarb uses relevancy ranking to bring the best search results to the top of the results page. The algorithm uses factors like the occurrences of a search term in a retrieved item and the number of times an item was retrieved or viewed previously to rank results. Himmelfarb boosts more recently published items and book content. You can help narrow results to the most relevant for you using the Refine Results options on the left side of the search results page.






Use the Peer-reviewed Journals option under Availability to limit to peer-reviewed results, or select books or dissertations with Content Type. See our short video on Health Information@Himmelfarb Search Basics for more tips on using facets to limit results.


Once you've found useful results, any record that has a green Available Online link has full-text available by clicking on the link. For many article results, you may also see a Download PDF link that allows you to directly download a PDF. For the most efficient linking to online content, see Finding Full-Text Content Made Easy!



For items like physical books, click the title in the results to open the full record and you can check the status of items on the shelves at Himmelfarb by looking under "Get it". The tools under "Send to" allow you to save a citation, print, email, export to RefWorks or save a permalink to the record.




Use the Sign in button highlighted in blue above to activate requesting options. <u>Sign in</u> with your GW UserID. If you can't physically come into the library to get an item, you can use our <u>delivery services</u> request form. If the item is on loan there will be an option to place a hold request.



If the book you want is at Gelman or one of the WRLC libraries, use the Consortium Loan Service (CLS) request form; this will request free delivery of the item from the owning library to Himmelfarb or the VSTC Library. See our video tutorial on using <u>Consortium Loan Services</u>. If an item is not available at either Himmelfarb or at WRLC libraries, we recommend placing a <u>Documents2Go</u> request to borrow it from another library or receive a scanned version for articles and chapter requests.

Once signed into Health Information @ Himmelfarb, it's also possible to save results or searches to My Favorites for future use.

Health Information @ Himmelfarb allows you to browse the Library's special collections in its <u>Special</u> <u>Collections Gallery</u>. Himmelfarb has both physical collections that are shelved together, and collections based on a particular topic or use. For example, you can look for a fiction title to expand your understanding of an issue or perspective in our <u>Humanities and Health Collection</u>. Or you can browse our <u>selection of streaming videos</u>.





Health Information @ Himmelfarb is a great place to search for the Library's physical resources like print books and media, to find and access e-books, and to search across multiple disciplines, or to start your research. It does not offer the precision searching of many of the library's specialized databases, like PubMed or Scopus. If you require an in depth search or are doing a systematic review, contact our reference librarians (himmelfarb@gwu.edu or 202-994-2850) who can advise you on where to search and how.
