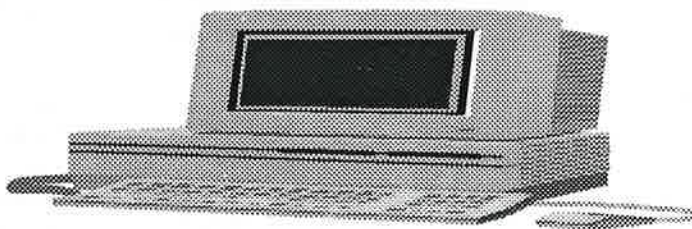

### Evening and Weekend Reference Assistance Available

The Himmelfarb Library is pleased to announce the introduction of evening and weekend reference assistance. Beginning May 1, 1996, reference hours will be extended to include the period from 6pm until 9pm Monday through Thursday and from 1pm until 4pm on Saturday. Patrons writing papers, doing research, or simply browsing for current information will now be able to stop by the Reference Desk for help on the way home from work, on the way to evening classes, or on Saturdays. ### Compact Disc DATABASE Update

The Himmelfarb Library has recently expanded its coverage of MEDLINE on compact disc and has acquired two new titles, BIOETHICSLINE and POPLINE. MEDLINE CD now covers the entire database, 1966 to the present. Topics include research, clinical practice, administration, policy issues, and health care services. The database is updated monthly.

BIOETHICSLINE contains over 35,000 records from 1975 to the present. It focuses on questions of ethics and public policy in the fields of health care and biomedical research. Topics include euthanasia, organ donation, the allocation of health care resources, AIDS, patient's rights, codes of professional ethics, new reproductive technologies, genetic engineering, abortion, behavior control, mental health therapies, and human experimentation. BIOETHICSLINE is updated bi-monthly. POPLINE contains over 207,000 citations, some dating back to 1872. Its coverage includes population, family planning and related health care, law, policy issues, death, demography, and public health. Included are citation and abstracts of journal articles, monographs, technical reports, and unpublished works. POPLINE is updated semi-annually. MEDLINE, BIOETHICSLINE and POPLINE, plus CANCERLIT, HEALTH PLAN, and CINAHL can be accessed from all three CD stations in the Library. Micromedex and Science Citation Index are available only at the middle CD station. The Library no longer receives Occupational Safety and Health.

### Extended Library Hours for Next Fall Semester

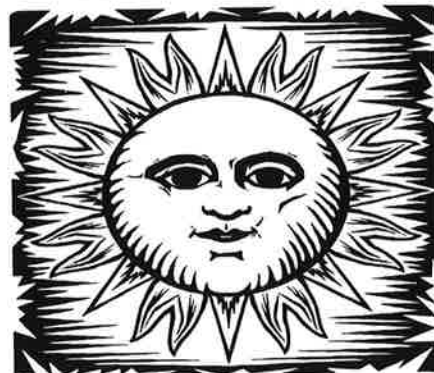

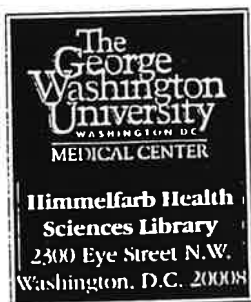
