Changes for MEDLINE and Other Databases

In early January, the Himmelfarb Library has switched to Winspirls — a Windows-based search program from SilverPlatter for the MEDLINE, HealthSTAR, CINAHL, Popline, Cancer, and Bioethicsline databases available in the reference area. Database content and format will remain the same. However, searchers will now be able to “point and click” as they select search terms and citations for printing. The switch to Winspirls is part of an overall move to a new compact disc tower on MedNet for the Library’s databases. This move will eventually allow desktop access to MEDLINE and related databases from all over the Medical Center. Drop-in demonstrations of the Winspirls software are scheduled in the Library classroom (B103) for the following times:

Update on Hospital Reading Room Resources

The Library branch in the hospital, the Hospital Reading Room (Room 1722), offers a variety of electronic resources through a series of four computers. These PCs offer the **Microsoft Office Suite (Word, PowerPoint, Access, and Excel)**, access to **HAL** and **GWIS2**, and a variety of CD-ROM full-text textbooks. These electronic resources include: **Scientific American Medicine** on CD-ROM; **Stat-Ref**, a

series of textbooks including **USP DI**, **Merck Manual**, **Stein's Internal Medicine**, and the **Current Diagnosis and Treatment series**; **Mosby's Emergency Medicine**, covering five emergency medicine texts; **MAXX: Maximum Access to Diagnosis and Therapy**, full-text of 20 specialty Manuals; and **AIDS Textbooks on CD-ROM**, a series of three AIDS textbooks. A networked printer is available.

Three current years of 50 journals are also included in the HRR, along with a collection of over 100 textbooks. A librarian is available at the HRR from 2-4pm Monday through Friday. ILL and search request forms are available along with a pick-up area for ILLs and completed searches from Himmelfarb. A book drop for Himmelfarb books is located directly inside the door. ■

Document Delivery at Himmelfarb Library: Obtaining Documents We Don't Own

Himmelfarb Library offers interlibrary loan services to obtain items the Library does not own for its users. If you need to get a copy of an article or borrow a book not owned by the Library or any other GWU libraries, see the Reference or Circulation desk for an ILL request form. Although most patrons do not pay for this service, it is not free. Currently, the Medical Center Administration funds up to \$10/request for requests made by full time faculty, staff and all students. This is the normal fee charged by most lending libraries that participate in the National Network of Library of Medicine's DOCLINE system. Himmelfarb interlibrary loan staff use DOCLINE to obtain approximately 90% of all interlibrary loan requests. Most academic medical libraries in the US and many hospital libraries use DOCLINE to borrow and lend materials.

DOCLINE is a very efficient system. The UI or AN number found on MEDLINE references links the requested document with a database which automatically routes the request to only libraries that own it. Typical DOCLINE requests take a day to reach the initial holding library (as long as citation information on the ILL request is complete and accu-

rate), another day to process, and three to four more days to arrive by regular US mail to the Library. Some factors can delay a request. If the first library to receive the request cannot fill it because the item is not on the shelves, it must be routed to the next library on the list. A rare item found at only a few libraries which have high lending demand can also result in additional time to fill. Requests for whole books or journal issues usually demand more processing and delivery time than article or chapter requests.

A form of DOCLINE is available to Grateful Med subscribers to obtain copies of articles found while searching MEDLINE or other NLM databases. This service is called Loansome Doc. Loansome Doc subscribers can automatically route requests for articles to a DOCLINE participant library. An arrangement must be made with the library in advance. The library will either provide the copy itself or will route it to another DOCLINE library to fill. Himmelfarb participates in Loansome Doc. GWUMC faculty, staff and students who are Grateful Med subscribers can use Loansome Doc to obtain article photocopies at the same rate charged for HPS service.
