

What do these topics all have in common? They have all been featured on <u>Himmelfarb Library's</u> blog this summer! Yes, it's true - Himmelfarb Library has a blog!

<u>The Rotation: A Himmelfarb Library Blog</u> is where we share information about resources, tools, and health news. The Rotation averages three new posts a week (typically on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays). How can you read The Rotation?

While some posts highlight Himmelfarb's resources, such as books, journals, databases, and selected Himmelfarb services, we write about more than just all the great things Himmelfarb provides to our users! We routinely write heavily researched posts about important topics relevant to medicine and health sciences, public health, and nursing. For example, a recent post on <u>National Minority Mental Health Awareness Month</u> explored what the scientific literature had to say about social determinants of mental health in minority and underserved populations. A June 2024 post for <u>Cancer Survivors Month</u> explored economic stability in the context of cancer survival.

Posts on The Rotation don't always focus on serious topics - we have a lighter side too. Sometimes, we'll take a serious topic and present it in a fun, more digestible way. Himmelfarb's Rebecca Kyser has tackled important topics like <u>Chat-GPT and A.I.</u>, <u>plagiarism</u>, <u>predatory publishing</u>, and <u>medical quackery</u> in fun, easily digestible comic strips complete with original characters such as Ponzi the Shark, and The Copycat Plagiarist. Other posts focus on healthy living topics including mental health, medical and health awareness topics, and recipes. We also highlight Healthy Living at Himmelfarb topics like our monthly <u>Study Break Guides</u> that feature free and affordable activities in and around Washington, D.C. Our <u>Humanities Highlights</u> series highlights books from <u>Himmelfarb's Humanities and Health Collection</u> which includes fiction and non-fiction selections that offer perspectives on being a health provider and being a patient. Our <u>Disorder in the Court</u> series examined true crime stories with medical connections.
