The second half of the book presents and rates Web sites

according to defined criteria that include: Target Audience, Unique Content, Links, Potential to Affect Health Quality, and Reliability of Information Sources. It rates the top 25 Web Sites (using the defined criteria mentioned above) in the following areas: Health Policy, Managed Care, Outcomes Research, Home Care Research, Ambulatory Services, Disease Management/Quality Management, Consumer Health, and Electronic Data Interchange.

**Handbook of Neurologic Rating Scales.** Edited by Robert M. Herndon, MD. Reference Section 15 RC 348.H29 1997.

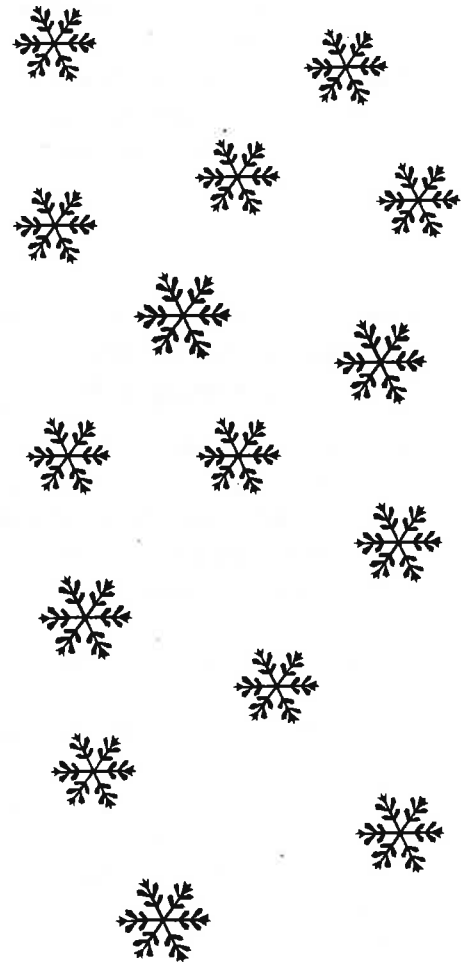
